Ensembles

With over 200 students in six different choirs plus SCAPA Voice, there are a lot of things going on and lots to keep track of. Knowing which choir you are in will simplify things significantly. Ensembles are usually set in the Spring and changes will usually not be made after classes begin.

Men's and Women's Chorus – These choruses are designed primarily for beginning and intermediate choral instruction. They will provide an understanding of the fundamentals of proper vocal techniques, choral techniques, and music theory (as it applies to selected pieces.) These choirs do not require an audition for enrollment.

The **Men's choir** is directed by Mr. Marsh. Highlights of the year include UK Male Chorus Day, concerts throughout the year, contest and performing at LHS athletic events.

The **Women's Choir** is directed by Mrs. Howard. Highlights of the year include KMEA Festival Contest, Women's Choir Festival (Feb), UK Bluegrass Choral Music Festival and concerts throughout the year.

Advanced Women's Choir – The Advanced Women's choir is made up of advanced women of all grade levels. Upper classmen take Womens' choir as a second or third choir and provide outstanding leadership. Many SCAPA Voice majors are also in Women's Choir. Advanced Womens' Choir is conducted by Mrs. Howard.

Laffayette Singers – "Singers" is a performance-oriented class geared to expose students to a wide variety of choral literature, ranging from the various historical styles through rehearsal and performance. Performances will take place throughout the school year. Singers is open to students by audition. Singers is directed by Mr. Marsh

Lafayette Chorale – The Lafayette Chorale is the highest level vocal ensemble of the Choral department at Lafayette. Performances will take place throughout the school year and students will be given opportunities to participate individually, as well as in the choral ensemble. Placement in Chorale is by audition and is directed by Mr. Marsh.

Madrigal Singers – This is a chamber ensemble, which is open to advanced vocal students (usually grades 11&12). Students in this ensemble will study and perform music from virtually all stylistic and historic periods and they will learn advanced vocal/choral techniques, sight-reading and basic musicianship. Directed by Mr. Marsh

SCAPA Woice – Vocal majors are enrolled in either Advanced Women's Choir, Singers or Chorale for scheduling purposes. If you are an incoming freshmen, you will be in Singers or Advanced Women's Choir . SCAPA majors participate in the Choir Gala, private lessons, recitals, and solo and ensemble, in addition to all of the activities of the choir you are enrolled in.

How to Move Up in the Choirs: Each choir is a preparation for entrance into the next chorus level. Our goal is to prepare each student for successful advancement in the choirs. Auditions are held in the Spring for the following school year. Each student singing in a choir is required to audition as part of the participation grade for that semester. The auditions are based largely upon sight-singing and musicianship skills taught throughout the school year.


Each year the Lafayette Choir seeks sponsors. This campaign is by far, our most successful fundraiser. We ask every student to sell 2 ads.

The Choral Department offers an outstanding opportunity to students for private voice study. The program offers students the opportunity to take individual voice lessons over a 10-week session each semester. The advantages to this program are cost and convenience. The rate for private lessons in Lexington is approx. \$15 per half-hour lesson or more. The M2 program at Lafayette is only \$110 for the 10week session, and the majority of the private instruction takes place in the practice rooms of the Lafayette music department, under the direction qualified of highly music consultants. Enrollment spots are limited.

Mr. Marsh is proud to direct the Lafayette Chorale, Singers, Madrigals, and Men's Chorus. He also teaches AP Music Theory and Music Technology. He is married to Tiffany who is the choral director at Western Hills High School in Frankfort. They live with their daughter Emory and dog Cosmo, in Midway.

Laura Howard is a native of Mt. Sterling, KY where she graduated from Montgomery County High School. She credits her involvement in the music programs of the Montgomery County Public Schools with the beginnings of her musical passion and ultimately, her career.

Mrs. Howard is a graduate of Morehead State University where she completed both her undergraduate and graduate degrees. As an undergraduate, she received her Bachelor of Music Education degree as a piano major on the choral/vocal education track of study. She also received the Master of Music degree while studying music education and choral conducting. Mrs. Howard recently completed (final) Level III training in the Kodaly philosophy of music literacy and education. She began her teaching career in 2002 at Southern Middle School in Fayette County where she was responsible for general music classes, grades 6-8, as well as the 6th, 7th and 8th grade choirs. She has also had a private piano and voice studio since 1996. For many years, Mrs. Howard has served as an accompanist for various choirs, soloists (both vocal and instrumental), and musical productions. She also serves as a church musician both as a pianist as well as a vocalist.

FUNDRAISING

Fundraising is a necessary part of any school music organization. Operating expenses for groups such as ours far exceed the dollars supplied by FCPS to the choral program. In order for the department to remain vital and offering quality experiences to our students, fundraiser participation is a necessity for each student. Money raised though fund-raising and fees are used for many purposes (seen and unseen) over the course of a school year. (See sidebar)

The Choral Department and Boosters work hard to keep student fees low and offset those low fees with fundraising efforts. Please keep in mind all of the often "unseen, behind the scenes" expenses when considering your level of commitment to fundraising. Your help is a necessity to continue this outstanding program, therefore, EACH STUDENT IS ASKED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE VARIOUS FUNDRAISERS THAT THE CHORAL DEPARTMENT SPONSORS EACH YEAR or give an In-lieu-of Donation.

IN-LIEU-OF or OPT-OUT CONTRIBUTIONS

This year, the booster board will again offer an "In-lieu-of" fundraising possibility for those who may be overburdened with several organizations to fund raise for or for those who would simply prefer not to sell items. The "In-lieu-of" program is intended to allow folks to still contribute to the organization allowing us to meet our fund-raising goals, but perhaps avoid selling items.

ANNUAL EVENTS AND DATES OF INTEREST

Stay tuned for more information to come about all of these events.

<u>Mastering Musicianship Lessons (M2)</u>: This is a great option for students to take private voice lessons after school for a reduced rate. The cost to students is \$110 for 10 lessons per semester. Register in the Fall.

<u>Gala and Silent Auction</u>: September 26 - This is the opening concert event for the concert season! All are welcome. Performers include: Singers, Chorale, Madrigals, and selected SCAPA Voice Majors.

Fall Concert: October 3 The Men's and Women's choirs perform in concert in Beeler Auditorium.

<u>UK Bluegrass Choral Music Festival</u>: October 4 and 5. This is required for SCAPA Voice majors but is a wonderful <u>optional</u> singing opportunity open to all LHS Choir students and is sponsored by the University of Kentucky Choral Department held at the UK Singletary Ctr. Nearly 500 Singers from across the state join for two days of rehearsal and a performance.

<u>Winter Concerts</u>: The Swing Choir, and Men and Women's Choirs perform their winter concert in Beeler auditorium on Lafayette's Campus. Singers, Madrigals and Chorale hold their concert at an area church or Singletary center.

<u>Lafayette Choral Invitational:</u> This event takes place in January. 7th and 8th grades from Lafayette's feeder schools are invited to work with the choirs at Lafayette. All Lafayette Choir Students are required to attend.

<u>Women's Choir Festival</u>: This Festival is a great event for our Women's choir. The LHS Women's Choir will join with several other schools in the Central Kentucky Area for a festival concert in March. This promises to be a fun day of singing and performing.

<u>UK Male Chorus Day:</u> This is open to all Men in the LHS Choirs. (It is required for the LHS Men's Choir). It takes place in January at the UK Singletary Center.

<u>Solo and Ensemble Contest</u>: This contest is held at Scott County High School (in Late February or March) for soloists and small ensembles. These are usually prepared with Mrs. Howard or Mr. Marsh outside of the school day. The student sings their solo or ensemble piece for an adjudicator. Sign-ups are in early January.

KMEA Festival Assessment: All choirs perform at Festival Assessment in March for comments and rating.

Spring Chorus Banquet: Celebrate the successes of the year at our annual choral banquet in early May.

Ice-Cream Concert: All choirs will perform at the Ice-Cream concert in the spring.
